

Thoughts From the Pastor, Phil Gulley

Acting as if ...

Have you ever been expected to celebrate an event you were in no mood to observe? I feel a bit that way this Christmas season, celebrating the Prince of Peace in a war-torn world. There is a hint of futility about it, until one remembers that Jesus never guaranteed peace so much as he described the mindset necessary for it—complete forgiveness, a radical love for the enemy, transformative compassion, and extravagant generosity. I hope one day to live in a world where these qualities are universally embraced and practiced, don't you? Instead, we live in a world of "until then." Until these qualities become pervasive, how shall we live?

In the 1920s, the Austrian psychotherapist, Alfred Adler, developed a therapeutic technique he called *acting as if*, affirming that "if you want a quality, act as if you already have it." In common parlance, we say, "fake it until you make it." I'm a big believer in the fake-it-until-you-make-it school of thought. I suspect Jesus believed it, too. Fake it until you make it. Practice love until it fills you. Exercise forgiveness until you feel it. Practice compassion until it becomes your true nature. Give unstintingly until it becomes a habit. Fake it until you make it.

Inherent to these virtues is the effort to understand, which means careful listening and thoughtful discernment, both difficult habits to learn, and yet so essential to global well-being. To that end, we're inviting you to participate in a Zoom workshop on the evenings of December 4th and 11th, when the Rabbis Dennis and Sandy Sasso and Quakers Dan and Jane Carter will meet with us via Zoom to discuss the current tensions in the Middle East, and the history that drives these difficulties. Just before the Zoom events, you'll be receiving a Zoom link so you can watch, ask questions, and learn.

To soften our hearts, we'll gather on Sunday, December 3rd, for meeting for worship, followed by our holiday pitch-in dinner. Meat dishes will be supplied, but you'll need to bring a side dish or dessert or both. We'll also be celebrating Snowflake Sunday that day, so come to the meetinghouse ready to participate.

There you have it, F(f)riends, the perfect month—an opportunity for joy, the chance to learn, and, as always at our meeting, the opportunity to love. If you've gotten out of the habit of community, I hope December finds you back at Fairfield, where you are cherished.
