

THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR, PHIL GULLEY

The Helping Hand

This past summer, I was chatting with Jim McClung, comparing our views on home maintenance and improvements. I mentioned hiring a man to build a screen house and Jim said he never paid anyone to do something for him he could do for himself. If I were as capable as Jim McClung, I would feel the same way, but since I'm not, I'm happy to pay skilled people to do things for me.

"They have families to food too," I told Jim, somewhat virtuously.

I do want people to be able to feed their families, but that's not the real reason I hire people to do things for me. The real reason is that it's cheaper to hire someone to do it right the first time than it is to hire someone to repair something I've messed up trying to fix myself.

There are five homes on the road where our farmhouse sits, each of them housing a competent male, all of whom I have called on for help after making a mess of something. They are kind men, all five of them, and hurry to help me, but sometimes I wonder if they chuckle with one another about my incompetence when I'm not around. Our relationships are so lop-sided that just once I'd like one of them to knock on my door and say, "Hey, what can you tell me about the Catholic's take on transubstantiation?" or "I'm writing a book and struggling with pronoun shifts. Could you give me a hand?" Sadly, that never happens.

Each of us wants to feel we've helped the communities we belong to. When the Quakers who founded Fairfield back in 1826 migrated here from North Carolina, each Friend was expected to contribute in some way to their new venture. A man well into his eighties offered to start the new graveyard when they arrived and so he did.

I think often, and with a grateful heart, of all the people who've raised their hands to help our Fairfield community, many of whom do it without fanfare or expectation of reward. I'd name names, but then would leave someone out and feel awful. Plus, there's not enough space.

I raise this subject because our Nominating Committee has been hard at work discerning the needs of our meeting and the gifts of its people. If they knock on your door asking for help, please know they didn't want a warm body to fill a slot. They saw in you a gift, passion, or skill that could be put to beneficial use. Please don't dismiss them, or think their judgment mistaken. They have asked you for a reason, so feel honored. You can even feel flattered if you wish. You've been chosen.

The upcoming year will be significant for Fairfield. We are (hopefully) emerging from a pandemic in a culture sorely in need of transformation. The bonds of unity which once knit our nation together are now frayed and weak. More than ever, Friends are called to be healers, prophets, and leaders. Just as science has labored to bring us back, now we all must labor to move us forward.

The following highlights are drawn from minutes for the October 10 Monthly Meeting:

- Jeff Gabbard, Lee Edmundson, and Phil Gulley are working to finish the Meeting's new website.
- We continue to maintain good financial health. As was anticipated, expenses which were due and paid
 in September erased the surplus of reserve funds reported at the end of August. Payment of Western
 Yearly Meeting assessments and a higher than budgeted insurance premium resulted in a deficit for the
 month of September.
- Due to high positivity rates of COVID, the COVID Committee feels that we should not resume inperson meeting for worship until children are vaccinated.
- Thanks to Frank Gladden and his crew, Bill Smith and Lee Comer for helping with shrubbery removal. Overgrown shrubbery along the county road in front of the building has been removed and bare ground will be seeded this fall.
- Trustees are using this time while we are unable to use the Meeting House to do maintenance and reorganization, and this will include updating of the mailboxes. If you want a mailbox please respond to Gan Baker at baker7298@sbcglobal.net and be sure to include how you want your label to read for instance, Baker Family or Ralph and Gan Baker. The designated committee mailboxes, i.e. Outreach, Christian Ed., etc., as well as those for Fairfield leadership, will definitely be retained. We will take requests through the end of the year, and probably update the mailboxes in January.
- The Finance Committee requested that the date of Monthly Meeting be changed from the second Sunday of the month to the third Sunday. This will allow the treasurer time to prepare the monthly financial statement and the Finance Committee to meet and review it. It was approved to move Monthly Meeting for Business to the third Sunday of the month.
- Next Monthly Meeting will be November 21.
