

Three Values That Serve Us Well

As you know by now, we're back to gathering via Zoom every Sunday morning. The day our Covid Committee and Ministry and Counsel made that decision, I learned of two vaccinated persons contracting the delta variant—Mark Strietelmeier's mother and our next-door neighbor, who is now quarantined at our farmhouse to avoid infecting family members.

When we returned to in-person meeting, we mentioned the possibility of returning to Zoom if conditions worsened, but I didn't think that would be likely given the development of vaccines. As it turns out, a degree in theology should never be confused for a degree in virology, and here we are again. I suspect this might well be our future pattern until Covid is defeated or managed—in person worship when infection rates are low, Zoom worship when infection rates rise. What won't change is our commitment to be an evolved and loving community in a world in sore need of community.

I catch myself returning time and again to a small storehouse of useful sayings, one of them is chiseled in the stone floor of the headquarters of the California Academy of Sciences. It reads, "It is not the strongest of the species that survives, nor the most intelligent that survives. It is the one that is most adaptable to change."

For years I though Darwin said that, but it turns out he didn't. It is, however, an accurate summation of his work, and a timely reminder of the inevitably of change and the importance of adaptation. A man in our town pastored a local congregation for several years. When Covid hit, he dismissed it as a hoax and insisted his church gather in person, unmasked, and singing. Last month, he attended a family reunion where several of the participants were ill with Covid. He died last week from Covid, his last days spent in the intensive care unit. His failure to adapt to a new reality literally killed him.

Unfortunately, this mindset runs dangerously rampant in our nation. White supremacists, unable to bear the thought of being a minority in an increasingly diverse country, are reacting with violence, injustice, and hate. Their failure to adapt to a new reality harms us all.

Every day we awaken, we are presented with a changing world. We are daily required to accept or adapt. This is the great human dilemma, knowing which changes merit our acceptance and which changes require our adaptation. No matter the situation, we are always called to compassion, justice, and wisdom, the three values that serve us well no matter the situation.

The following highlights are drawn from minutes for the August 8 Monthly Meeting:

- Between July revenue resulting in a surplus, and the general reserve fund being slightly above the targeted amount, we continue to maintain good financial health.
- After a one week delay, a program for children ages 3 to 8th grade during Meeting for Worship, began on July 25. The program is led by Tara Stewart and Gan Baker.
- Hugh Hanlin is planning to lead a Quakerism 102 class beginning in the fall. Details will be forthcoming. Over 60% of people responding to the survey this year requested this offering. A Quakerism 101 class will probably be offered next year.
- A Memorandum of Understanding between Dr. Sherry Strafford Rediger and Fairfield Friends Meeting was presented and approved. This agreement establishes terms for a continuation of counseling services at Fairfield. Please see the August 8 Monthly Meeting minutes for details.
- Lee Comer remains in contact with the Plainfield Planning Commission and has presented Trustees with correspondence from them regarding how roadway plans and park development are proceeding. Nothing regarding the intersection is imminent.
- Sarah Lookabill reported that 28 back-to-school bags were delivered for the staff at Patricksburg Elementary School.
- Randy Horton reported the Men's Group was looking to have a fish fry during October. It will consist of preordered bags of cooked fish only, and no meal items will be available. Orders will be taken in advance. The event will be limited to the Fairfield community and not publicized to the wider community.
- Please stay tuned for Email regarding the conditions for Meeting for Worship as these continue to evolve. For now, we will continue to wear masks inside the Meeting House.
